#### **Auckland**

## **NZISA FACT**

NZISA's first New Zealand Indian Cricket Representative Team was selected in 1968. They played a drawn match against a Thames Valley XI on 30th/31st March at Herres Park in Te Aroha. Thames Valley made 104 and 123, and NZISA made 197.

The team was: Bhikhu Bhana, Kanti Budhia (Christchurch); Ishwar Magan, Lakhu Dayal, Karsan B. Patel, Manu C. Parag (Wellington); Parbhu Parsotam, Narotam Puna (Waikato, captain); Dahya C. Patel, Kanu C. Patel, Jasmat F. Patel and Hira Bhana (Auckland).

The following year on 29th/30th March, NZISA played against a strong Hutt Valley team at Te Whiti Park. Hutt were dismissed for 181 in their first innings, with NZISA replying with 136, and, after Hutt scored 162 in their second innings, they needed 207 runs to win the match. They were 101 for 8 when bad light ended play on day two.
