JUDE MENEZES ON THE MOVE

Jude Menezes, Women's Black Sticks Assistant Coach, has accepted a role as the new head coach of the Japan Women's team. Jude has been an integral part of the Hockey NZ set up since 2014 and has added an immense amount of value with his coaching and expertise with the Black Sticks goalkeepers and defensive players. Jude has had some great personal highlights with the Black Sticks including the semifinal win against England, followed by the gold medal at the Commonwealth Games in 2018, and the Oceania Cup win in 2019 which qualified the Black Sticks to the Tokyo Olympics.

Jude has had a big connection with Indian hockey in New Zealand, where he has had connections with the Pukekohe Indian Sports Club as head coach for their Men's squad.

NZISA FACT

Soccer was introduced to QBT in 1986 which demonstrated the diversification of Indian sport as Indians had participated in soccer for some time. In 1971 Pravin Jeram, a goalkeeper who played for Auckland's Eastern Suburbs club, was selected for New Zealand in the third test against New Caledonia, and was later selected between 1975 and 1978, making 18 appearances. Jack Nathu, who played for Wellington City, was selected to tour New Caledonia in 1971 but the trip was cancelled.

Indian soccer could be dated back at to around 1982 in Wellington. After being denied admission to the Wellington Football Association Mercantile League due to lack of available grounds, WISC started its own informal competition with seven other teams who were also denied entry.

The first soccer game between two ISC's occurred in 1983 when Wellington played Auckland in an exhibition match at QBT in Pukekohe. Wellington emerged victorious but were unable to redeem their prize: vouchers to Auckland's KFC and Pizza Hut establishments. NZISA officially adopted soccer as a QBT sport in 1985 where it was played for the Pizza Hut and then Dial-A-Dino Pizza Trophies till 1996. Soccer took a break and did not reappear until 2011. It has been taken off the QBT schedule due to lack of team entries.

ISC NEWS

Auckland

For the 2021 hockey season, AISC had five Men's, one Women's, three youth (two Boys and one Girls) and 10 Junior teams. Our Women's played in the Division 3 competition and were unbeaten for the season with 101 goals and 3 against, promoting them to Division 2 next season. We have signed Stephen Jenness as the Men's coach for 2022.

We took our youth teams to Christchurch in July for five days playing local club teams. This was a very successful trip in terms of club spirit and everyone who attended had a great time. We had three players, Prashant Patel. Akshay Chauhan and Keshan Narsai selected for the Auckland Development squad, but their tournament was cancelled due to Covid.

As for cricket, we have five Men's 40 Over and two Men's 20/20 teams. Our club AGM was scheduled for November but this has been postponed to early next year due.

BOPISC has had quite an active year. Following the Women's team win at QBT, our cricket team has taken the field and featured in the local T20 competition in November. We have been fortunate to have been able to play cricket in Covid Level 2 restrictions and this is something we are grateful for. We have had to postpone Golden Oldies for another year and will hopefully be able to host this event next year.

Planning for the NZISA Cricket Tournament is underway and we look forward to hosting this event in January. With borders being closed we haven't seen the influx of Indian students that we normally get, however we have seen numbers grow in terms of interest in playing cricket.

Central Districts

CDISC have had a good year with a full committee of three executive and four committee members. The year started off with our AGM in March which had a good turnout. We entered a Men's hockey team into the B Section for QBT where it was great to get back on the field after 2020. QBT also saw us award and recognise our two newest life members, Kanu Ravji and Sandeep Patel. Our Golden Oldies team was geared up for the event in Rotorua but with the Covid lockdown this year, are now gearing up for 2022.

Our committee is currently busy organising our 40th Anniversary Celebration which is to be held in Palmerston North on Saturday 19th March 2022 where we will celebrate the clubs history and recognise members with the presentation of CDISC Service Awards.
