ISC NEWS

Auckland

AISC's hockey season included five Men's teams, one Women's, one Youth Boy's, one Youth Girl's and ten Junior teams.

Our Premier Men's team were boosted with former Black Sticks Stephen Jenness injecting his flair as a player/coach, and goalkeeper Dominic Dixon. The men competed in the inaugural Intercity Competition with Counties, reaching the semi-finals. They also competed in the Punjabi Tournament in Melbourne in September.

The Women's team, newly promoted to Division 2, reached their second consecutive final, losing on a penalty shootout. Auckland Hockey have offered them the opportunity of being promoted to Division 1 for the 2023 season, giving AISC the option of fielding two teams. The teams are coached by former Argentinian international Rocio Gonzalez, who has committed her services as Women's Coaching and Development Manager for 2023.

Cricket wise, AISC had five Men's teams playing 50 Over games. For the 2023 we are expecting to register six ODI teams and one 20/20 team. Dilipbhai Parbhu was selected and played in the NZ Over-60 Masters Team, who recently competed in a week long tournament in Brisbane. Hockey prizegiving was held in early November and the AISC AGM was held in late November.

Bay of Plenty

The club has had a great year which started with the Women's team winning at QBT. It was great to win the tournament for the second year running. Our cricket team has just started its season and is currently undefeated in the Reserve Grade. Over the years we have been proactive in providing coaching for our players, and this year have had a coach from Ireland come and join our joint Premier team. The club recently purchased a car for the coach to use during his stay, and we have been doing a lot of fundraising to cover these costs. We have been fortunate to have the support of many local businesses who have kindly sponsor us.

We are now looking to host the 2023 NZISA Cricket Tournament. We hope that the clubs can reach out to their communities and organise a team so that we can have a good tournament in January.

All in all, BOPISC is functioning really well. We have been very proactive in creating opportunities for members, and have been very successful on all fields.
