# **EXECUTIVE MEETING**

NZISA held their Executive Meeting in March which was hosted by Christchurch Indian Sports Club. A big thank you to them and to all delegates for attending especially as the meeting was a week after the Christchurch terror attack.

The meeting was very productive with organising of the cricket rep fixture, implementing changes to QBT format and the creation of a website to increase its profile.

NZISA has donated \$301 to the Christchurch Mayoral Fund to support the victims of the Christchurch attacks, with an additional \$1285 raised from the cricket rep fixture raffle.

# QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY TOURNAMENT (QBT)

The NZISA cricket representative fixture against the Northern Districts Maori cricket team was played on Saturday 30th March at Seddon Park in Hamilton.

It has been a long time since NZISA has had the opportunity to play a representative cricket match, and NZISA selected an experienced team which saw the game played with some memorable performances.

A summary of recent news from the 8 Indian Sports Clubs:

#### **Auckland**

AISC has 5 Men's hockey teams and 2 Junior teams for 2019. Unfortunately no Women's team are entered this year. AISC had a good turn out for their Junior muster. Their inter-city competition started on 16th March.

# **Bay of Plenty**

BOPISC had their Men's cricket team make the club competition semi-finals. Their Men's hockey team has also started in their inter-city competition. The club is now focused on organising for QBT in Rotorua.

#### **Central Districts**

CDISC had their AGM in March. No new faces joined the committee. Sanjay Patel carried on in the Presidents role for 2019. Younger club members who participated did very well in the U23 Barbarians hockey team that played in February.

#### **Christchurch**

# Wellington

#### **NEW CHRISTCHURCH HOCKEY TURFS**

Christchurch has two brand new internationally certified hockey turfs at the new Nga Puna Wai Sports Hub that opened in December 2018. Hockey is the second sporting code to take up its new home following the official opening of the athletics track and field facilities in October 2018. 12 outdoor tennis courts and two rugby league pitches are due to open soon. There will also be two multi-use community playing fields, a shared sports hub building with administration facilities, public toilets, changing facilities, children's play zone, athletics building and covered seating.

#### **NZISA FACT**

One of the most significant developments in Indian sport was the acquisition of a trophy which would become the most cherished in New Zealand Indian sport.

The New Zealand Indian Central Association minutes of 13th April 1963 recorded that Mr Morari Soma of Auckland was permitted to address the Conference regarding activities and aims of the newly formed Indian Central Sports Organisation. He intimated that the Organisation was looking for a donor for the proposed "Dhyan Chand Trophy" which was to be the prize presented to the winning team competing at the annual hockey tournament. He suggested that the Organisation would be honored if New Zealand Indian Central Association, as a parent body, would agree to donating this trophy. After discussions it was moved that the Indian Central Association donate the trophy to the Central Sports Organisation. The motion was carried and the amount of £25 was also approved to purchase the trophy.

The trophy was contested for the first time in 1963 with Wellington hosting the tournament. Wellington won the first event and followed with another win in 1964 with Auckland winning in 1965. Christchurch won in 1966 being the first 'minor' club to do so. Pukekohe won for the first time in 1972 and Central Districts in 2008 with Bay of Plenty, North Harbour and Waikato still competing at QBT for their first win.
